- 1 The Amazing Spider-Man Bronze Group Plus.** This short box contains a number of **Amazing Spider-Man** issues from #141-375 (most are in the #141-200 range). The rest of the box consists of miscellaneous Marvels from the Silver, Bronze, and Modern ages, a couple of DCs, and for the discriminating comic connoisseur, 11 copies of **Beavis and Butthead** #1.
- 2 The Amazing Spider-Man Group Plus.** This short box contains mostly **Amazing Spider-Man** (second series) issues, with a few other Spidey-related titles from the same era (**Spider-Man Unlimited**, etc.) also included.
- 3 Atlas/Seaboard Group Plus.** About half of the comics in this short box are Atlas/Seaboard issues. The rest are Modern Age Marvels (most from the Epic imprint) and DCs. Rounding out the group is a trade paperback edition of **Origins of Marvel Comics**.
- 4 The Avengers Bronze Age Group.** A nice run of Avengers, extending into the Modern Age, is "assembled" in this long box.
- 5 Classics Illustrated Group Plus.** Approximately 30 **Classics Illustrated** are the highlight of this short box. The rest is made up of approximately 30 Gold Keys, a handful of Harveys, and Modern Age comics from various publishers.
- 6 DC Bronze Group Plus.** This long box averages GD condition. Included are many Richie Rich comics, Silver and Bronze Age **Superboy** issues, and some Modern Age **Superman** comics.
- 7 DC Bronze Group Plus.** This mostly-DC long box features **Action**, **Adventure**, and **Aquaman** issues, mostly from the early Bronze Age. A number of **Alpha Flights** are included, and most of the other books also start with A, most notably a few Silver Age **A Date With Judy** issues.
- 8 DC Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box also includes Silver Age books. In addition to DCs, Dells and Marvels are represented.
- 9 DC Bronze/Silver Plus Group (Various).** Short box of comics, majority of which are DC, heavy on Superman and Superboy titles such as **Action Comics** and **Adventure Comics**. More Bronze than anything else, but also a goodly number of Silver Age, plus a few Modern Age books. Marvel, Charlton, and Gold Key make up most of the rest of this lot.
- 10 DC/Marvel Plus Bronze/Modern Group.** Short box of DC and Marvel titles (about 80% of all books), but also including comics from Charlton, Atlas/Seaboard, EC reprints, and Modern Comics. Numerically, predominant titles are **Green Lantern** and associated titles, **Superman Family**, **Web of Spider-Man**, and **What If**. Mostly in high grade.
- 11 DC Bronze Age Group Plus.** This full long box includes Bronze Age **Flash** issues, a number of **Korak** and (post-Kubert) **Tarzan** issues, and miscellaneous 1980s comics from various publishers.
- 12 DC Silver Group Plus.** More Silver Age DCs than anything else, but quite a few Silver Age ACGs, several Dells/Gold Keys, and a smattering of Charltons, Archie Adventure Series, and Classics Illustrated in an interesting short box lot.
- 13 DC/Marvel Silver/Bronze Group Plus.** Almost full short box of superhero comics. Mostly Silver and Bronze Age DC and Marvel comics, plus some modern comics and smaller publishers.
- 14 DC Modern Age Group Plus.** This long box contains titles from DC, Marvel, and other publishers. Most are Modern Age and Bronze Age books. More than half of the box is **Justice League**; other runs include **Invaders** and **Superman's Pal Jimmy Olsen**.
- 15 DC Modern Age Group Plus.** Most of the comics in this long box are DCs, with Marvels making up most of the rest. Some Bronze Age books are included. Runs include **Classic X-Men** and a number of Batman-related comics.
- 16 DC Modern Age Plus Group.** This long box contains DC and Marvel titles from the Modern and Bronze Ages (with a few Silver Age books). Among many other titles is a run of **World's Finest**.
- 17 DC Modern Age Group.** This short box contains 1980s and 1990s DC comics, with a few Silver Age **Sea Devils** and **Rip Hunter** issues livening things up.
- 18 DC/Marvel Silver/Bronze Age Group Plus (Various).** Short box with mostly Silver and Bronze DCs and Marvels, and Bronze Charltons. The few exceptions include some Dells/Gold Keys, Towers, and a couple of Golden Age Marvel/Atlases.
- 19 DC Silver Age Group Plus.** This lot of approximately 25 comics includes DCs (most are **Challengers of the Unknown**) and Charltons, plus a couple of Modern Age Marvels.
- 20 Dell Golden/Silver Plus Group.** Short box of unbagged, mostly reading copies of Dell favorites with a smattering of DC, Charlton, Harvey, and Fawcett tossed in for flavor. Titles include **Tarzan**, **Roy Rogers**, and **Walt Disney Comics and Stories** (multiple copies of each), and many more.
- 21 Dell Miscellaneous Silver Age Group Plus.** This long box is highlighted by a variety of Silver Age Dell and Gold Key comics as well as Silver Age **Rawhide Kid**. Miscellaneous titles from various publishers round out the box.
- 22 Dell Group Plus.** This long box spans many publishers as well as eras from the 1960s through the present day. Silver Age Dells and Modern Age Marvels predominate.
- 23 Dell Golden Age Group.** This full long box contains approximately 300 Dell comics dating as far back as 1944, as well as a few Gold Keys. Approximately 90 percent are **Walt Disney's Comics and Stories**. Half a dozen **Dell Giants** and a **Little Lulu** or two round out the group. The condition is as follows: 20% GD/VG, 40% GD, 30% FR/GD (many with detached or partially detached covers), and 10% PR or FR (many coverless).
- 24 Disney Group Plus.** Approximately sixty early 1990s Disney comics are a highlight of this group. This short box also has ten Silver Age **Adventure Comics** issues. The rest are miscellaneous Modern Age comics.

- 25 Fantastic Four Modern Group Plus.** This long box also includes some Bronze Age FF issues, as well as a few miscellaneous, non-FF titles.
- 26 Fantastic Four Modern Group.** This full box lot has NM multiples of John Byrne-era **Fantastic Four**, all in the #232-267 range.
- 27 The Incredible Hulk Bronze Group Plus.** This long box features approximately 150 Incredible Hulk issues, mostly late Bronze Age and Modern Age. The rest of the box (consisting mostly of 1970s comics) is highlighted by approximately 45 issues of Howard the Duck.
- 28 Iron Man Modern Group Plus.** This long box is highlighted by approximately 120 Modern Age Iron Man issues. The rest of the box consists of miscellaneous comics, mostly of Bronze Age vintage.
- 29 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This full short box mostly contains "reading copies", though many are FN or even VF. A few low-grade Silver Age **Amazing Spider-Man** issues are a highlight. Most of the rest are Bronze Age Marvel and Charlton, with a few Silver Age DC books included. Approximately 40-50 of the comics are missing the top half of the front cover.
- 30 Marvel Bronze Age Group.** This short box includes a near-complete run of **Captain America** #201-285, as well as **Tower of Shadows** #1-5, and the 1980s **Dr. Strange** #39-55. The rest are mostly Silver Age and early Bronze Age Marvels.
- 31 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This short box, four-fifths full, contains a number of key books. How do **Amazing Spider-Man** #252, **Strange Tales** #135, and **Hero for Hire** #1 strike you? The aforementioned **Amazing** title is well-represented with issues in the #150-250 range. Other than some Jack Kirby **Kamandis**, the rest are Silver Age and early Bronze Age Marvels.
- 32 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This short box boasts a near-complete run of **Thor** #195-342 (including the era's annuals). Also included are **Howard the Duck** #10-20, and **Tarzan** issues from both Marvel and DC.
- 33 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** Cap and Conan dominate this long box. The **Captain America** comics number approximately 150 and span the issue range from #127-#410. Approximately 30 **Conan the Barbarian** (#6 is the lowest issue number) and **Conan the King** comics are another highlight. Miscellaneous comics (many non-Marvel) round out the group.
- 34 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box is mostly made up of Marvels, and spans the Silver, Bronze, and Modern Ages. Twenty or so Dell/Gold Key comics round out the group.
- 35 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box also includes Silver Age and Modern Age books. Though a few Harvey comics are included, Marvels dominate. Runs include **Spider-Woman**, **Silver Surfer**, and **Incredible Hulk**.
- 36 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box also includes a number of Modern Age DCs. Runs of **Thor** and **New Teen Titans** are among the highlights.
- 37 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box is mostly Marvel, but also includes some Dells and other miscellaneous comics, including some from the Silver and Modern Ages, plus a Golden Age book or two. Runs include **Hulk** and **Little Iodine**.
- 38 Marvel Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box of Marvels includes some Modern Age books. Runs of **Amazing Spider-Man** and **Spectacular Spider-Man** are included.
- 39 Marvel Bronze Age Spider-Man Group Plus.** This full long box boasts a high-grade run of **Spectacular Spider-Man** #1-72, a near-complete NM run of **Marvel Tales** #37-110, and some miscellaneous 1980s non-Spidey comics.
- 40 Marvel/DC/Dell and More Miscellaneous Comics Group.** Mostly Silver and Bronze Age Marvels, DCs, and Dells, but also a few comics from the 1950s in this short magazine boxful potpourri.
- 41 Marvel Modern/Bronze Group Plus.** A two-thirds-full short box with a few **Classics Illustrated** comics, a group of **Conan** comics, and a run of **Fantastic Four** spanning issues #155 to #265 (but not a complete run). Most appear to be in excellent condition. There are a few more Modern than Bronze Age comics, but it's a pretty close split.
- 42 Marvel/DC Bronze/Silver Group.** A half-full short box with a nice variety of Marvel and DC Bronze Age comics, plus a few low-grade DC Silver Age comics. This lot also includes a single pulp (**Detective Story Magazine** July 1943) and a Big Little Book-style sports book (**The Hockey Spare** published by Saalfeld).
- 43 Marvel Modern Group Plus.** Full short box of Modern Marvel comics, plus a few Bronze Age DCs and comic-related paperbacks. There are multiple copies of Marvel's **Warriors of the Shadow Realm** magazine.
- 44 Marvel/DC Bronze/Modern/Silver Group.** One mostly full short box of Bronze and Modern Age comics, with a few Silver Age mixed in. Included are several high-grade early issues of **Spectacular Spider-Man**, some miscellaneous comic-related magazines, and a small group of older coverless comics.
- 45 Marvel Modern Age Group Plus.** The many Marvels in this long box are joined by comics from Gold Key and other publishers. Short runs of **Web of Spider-Man** and **What If** are among the titles.
- 46 Marvel Modern Group Plus.** This long box also includes some Bronze Age books. Runs include **The New Mutants**, **Nova**, and **The Punisher**. A few DC comics are also included.
- 47 Marvel Modern Age Group Plus.** Marvels, DCs, and **Classics Illustrated** make up this long box, which also includes Silver and Bronze Age books. Runs of **Doctor Strange** and **Captain Marvel** (the Marvel Comics incarnation), as well as about a dozen **Amazing Spider-Man** issues are among those worthy of special mention.
- 48 Marvel Modern Age Plus Group.** This long box contains mostly Marvel comics but also has DCs. Most books are from the Modern Age, although Bronze Age books are also included. About half of the box is **Defenders**, though runs of **Daredevil** and **Amazing Spider-Man** are also represented.

- 49 Marvel Modern Age Superhero Group Plus.** One full long box. Half are mid-80s titles (many limited series), one-fourth are **Spider-Woman**, one-fourth are miscellaneous 1970s titles.
- 50 Marvel Modern Age Superhero Group Plus.** This full long box of mid-1980s titles averages NM, and consists mostly of X-Men spin-offs (**New Mutants**, etc.). A few non-Marvels are also included.
- 51 Marvel Modern Age Superhero Group.** About half of this full long box consists of sets of Alpha Flight #1-12. Most of the rest is NM multiples of **Marvel Super-Heroes Secret Wars**, and yes, a couple of copies of the key issue #8 are among them. Some other miscellaneous 1980s titles round out the box.
- 52 Marvel Modern Age Group Plus.** This short box, one-third full, contains approximately 40 Modern Age Marvels and about 15 Silver Age Marvels.
- 53 Marvel Silver Age Group Plus.** More than half of the comics in this long box are Marvels, with Gold Keys, Dells, and a Fawcett **Dennis the Menace** or two making up the rest (some are Bronze, Modern, or even Golden Age books). Runs include **Daredevil**, **Defenders**, and **Web of Spider-Man**.
- 54 Marvel/DC Plus Silver/Bronze Age Group (Various publishers)** Just a couple of dozen books in this lot, but an interesting mix of Marvel and DC, plus a few comics from other publishers, mostly reading-copy quality. Extra bonus: issues #1 and 2 of **Heavy Metal**.
- 55 Marvel Team-Up Group Plus.** This long box has more **Marvel Team-Up** than you can shake a web at, and if that's not enough **Spider-Man** for you, most of the rest consists of **Marvel Tales**.
- 56 Miscellaneous Silver/Modern Group.** One full short box of Marvel, Charlton, Archie, Harvey, and DC comics. Mostly Silver and Modern Age, but there is also a bit of Bronze. Lots of variety!
- 57 Miscellaneous Modern Group.** A full long box full of modern comics, from many publishers. Well-represented titles in this box include: **Grimjack**, **Judge Dredd**, **Ms. Tree**, **The Spirit** (Kitchen Sink), and **Alpha Flight**.
- 58 Miscellaneous Silver/Bronze/Modern Group.** Very full short box with a real mixture of Charlton, Marvel, DC, Harvey, and Dell comics. Superhero, romance, war, sci-fi, and other genres are all represented.
- 59 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box contains mostly Bronze Age comics from many different publishers. A few Silver Age **Strange Tales** and 40-50 issues of DC's **Secret Origins** are among the highlights.
- 60 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group.** This long box contains comics from several different publishers (mostly Bronze Age). Quite a few Tarzan books (from various series and publishers) are among them.
- 61 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box contains miscellaneous comics from various publishers. About 70 issues of **West Coast Avengers** (and **Avengers West Coast**), approximately 20 issues of **Warlord**, and a number of Charlton comics are highlights.
- 62 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box contains comics from many different publishers, mostly Bronze Age or later. Some issues of **Detective Comics** (including a couple of Silver Age) and 25 or so **Elementals** are highlights.
- 63 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box also includes Modern Age and Silver Age books. Publishers include Marvel, DC, Gold Key, and independent publishers. Runs include **G. I. Combat** and **Machine Man**.
- 64 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box encompasses DC, Marvel, and Dell/Gold Key comics. Some Modern Age books are also included. Runs include **Boris Karloff Tales of Mystery**, **Marvel Comics Presents**, and various Batman-related titles.
- 65 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This long box consists mostly of Marvels, with DCs and Gold Keys making up the remainder. Some are Modern Age books, with one or two from the Silver Age also included.
- 66 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This short box includes Bronze Age Marvel, DC, and Charlton comics, as well as a few Modern Age Marvels, digest comics (mostly Archies), and miscellaneous magazines.
- 67 Miscellaneous Bronze Age Group Plus.** This short box, two-thirds full, is highlighted by a mid-grade copy of key book **Giant-Size Defenders** #1. The rest are Bronze Age DCs and Marvels and some Silver Age Marvels and Dells.
- 68 Miscellaneous Comic-Related Books Group.** This lot of approximately 30 books is highlighted by softcover copies of editions 4, 5, and 6 of the Overstreet guide. It also includes **Mad**-related titles, a book on movie serials, some hardcover British Marvel annuals, books on Will Eisner and Al Williamson, "Far Side" books, **Heavy Metal** magazines, and Dutch and Norwegian graphic novels.
- 69 Miscellaneous Comic Fanzine Group Plus.** This lot includes approximately 15 early comic fanzines (**Rockets Blast Comic Collector**, **Funnyworld**, etc.) as well as a Walt Disney coloring book and the Dell mass-market paperback **The Story of Walt Disney**.
- 70 Miscellaneous Comic Magazines Group.** This short box mostly contains issues of **Cinefantastique** as well as comic-related magazines. Also in the box are the trade paperbacks **Tales of the Dark Knight**, **The Greatest Batman Stories Ever Told**, and **The Death of Superman**.
- 71 Miscellaneous Comic Magazines Group.** This short box contains mostly **Starlog** magazines, as well as other science fiction and comic-book mags (**Comics Collector**, etc.). A copy of the 2001 **Comic Book Checklist** rounds out the group.
- 72 Miscellaneous Comic Magazines Group.** This short box, three-fourths full, holds magazines such as **Epic**, **Starlog**, **Comic Feature**, and others.
- 73 Miscellaneous Comic Magazines Group.** This short box, two-thirds full, consists mostly of **Savage Sword of Conan** and **Heavy Metal** magazines. Also included are some early-80s **Conan** comics, a couple of German-language graphic novels, and well-used copies of Overstreet Guides #10 and #17.
- 74 Miscellaneous Disney Books Group.** This lot consists of the following issues of Gladstone's **The Carl Barks Library**: #13, #22 (four copies), and #25. Also included is Gladstone's **Walt Disney Comics First Appearances**.

- 75** **Miscellaneous Modern Age Group Plus.** This long box spans G through K in the alphabet, which in this case means a bunch of early-80s **Green Lantern**, lots of 90s **Ghost Rider**, a few 80s **G.I. Joe** and a few 70s **House of Mystery**, among other titles.
- 76** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Group.** This short box contains miscellaneous Modern Age comics, many of which are of the "mature readers only" variety.
- 77** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group** One long box (one-third full) of 1980s and some 1970s Marvel and DC titles.
- 78** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Group.** One full long box of mid-1980s Marvel, DC, and independent comics in NM condition.
- 79** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group.** This full long box of mostly mid-80s titles has many Spider-Man titles (**Marvel Team-Up**, **Web of Spider-Man**, etc.) and miscellaneous comics from independent publishers.
- 80** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group.** A full long box of NM comics, primarily 1980s Marvel and DC.
- 81** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group.** This full long box includes five high-grade copies of the hard-to-find **Destroyer Duck #1** (the first appearance of Groo). The rest are assorted 1980s titles, plus a couple of FR Silver Age DCs.
- 82** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group.** This full long box features a near-complete run of **The Thing #1-30** with multiple copies of most, some miscellaneous 1980s independents (**Boris the Bear**, **Destroyer Duck**, etc.), and a few oddball British digest editions (with Marvel characters).
- 83** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group.** This full long box of NM comics has mostly 1980s Marvel titles (with multiple copies of most).
- 84** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Superhero Group.** This full long box includes Marvel, DC, and independent titles. Almost all are in superb NM or even NM+ condition. Multiple copies of Frank Miller's **Elektra Saga** and **Ronin** are included.
- 85** **Miscellaneous Modern Comics Group.** This full short box consists mostly of little-known independent comics. Many have Christian themes. Marvel's Pope John Paul and Mother Teresa comics are included, and on a secular note, some early 80s **Conan** issues are in the box. Also included is Richard O'Brien's book **The Golden Age of Comic Books**.
- 86** **Miscellaneous Modern Age Comics.** This short box of miscellaneous titles is highlighted by runs of **Elfquest**, **Conan**, **King Conan** and **Conan the King**. Also included are a **Rocketeer** graphic novel by Dave Stevens, a **Rio** graphic novel by Doug Wildey, and a copy of the 22nd edition of the Overstreet guide.
- 87** **Miscellaneous Modern Age Comics.** This short box mostly contains post-1980 comics, though a few Bronze Age books are included as well. Runs include **Jonah Hex**, **Ka-Zar**, **Airboy** (the Eclipse series), **Camelot 3000**, and **Amethyst**.

- 90** **Miscellaneous Silver Age Group.** This long box is long on variety, with Silver and Bronze Age titles from DC, Marvel, Charlton, and Gold Key.
- 91** **Miscellaneous Silver Age Superhero Group.** This long box is chock full of classics. The condition is strictly "reading copy" caliber, but what good reads they are: lots of **Strange Tales**, **Sgt. - 94** **Miscellaneous Silver Age Superhero Group.** This long box contains various Silver and Bronze Age titles. Most are Dells, but some Charlton and DC titles are also included.
- 95** **Miscellaneous Silver Age Group Plus.** This long box also includes Bronze Age and some Golden Age books. Publishers include Marvel, Dell/Gold Key, and DC.
- 96** **Miscellaneous Silver Age Group Plus.** Giveaway comics and Christian titles (especially **Treasure Chest**) dominate this long box. King, Dell, and Gold Key are the primary publishers, though some Marvels are included. Some of the comics are Bronze Age or Modern Age titles.
- 97** **Miscellaneous Silver Age Group Plus.** This short box spans almost the entire history of comics, with a variety of Golden, Silver, Bronze and Modern Age comics from numerous publishers, including a small run of Silver Age **Fantastic Four**.
